# Stability of Pinelas-Septoicosic functional equation

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**Abstract:** In this paper, we find the general solution of a Septoicosic functional equation (11) for all  $x, y \in X$  and investigate its general Hyers-Ulam stability in Banach Space using direct and fixed point methods.

**Keywords:** Banach space, fixed point, Hyers-Ulam stability, Pinelas-Septoicosic functional equation.

## 1. Introduction

The stability phenomenon presented by Th. M. Rassias is called the generalized Hyers-Ulam stability. In 1994, a generalization of the Rassias theorem was obtained by Gavruta [1] by replacing the unbounded Cauchy difference by a general control function. In [2], Ulam proposed the general Ulam stability problem: "When is it true that by slightly changing the hypotheses of a theorem one can still assert, that the thesis of the theorem remains true or approximately true?" In [3], Hyers gave the first affirmative answer to the question of Ulam for additive functional equations on Banach spaces.

The issue of stability of functional equations has appeared in connection with a question that Ulam [4] posed in 1940. Hyers [3], by using direct method, brilliantly gave a partial answer for the case of the additive Cauchy functional equation for mappings between Banach Spaces. This result was then improved by Aoki [5] and Rassias [6], who weakened the condition for the bound of the norm of the Cauchy difference. Many papers are written in this direction such as [7-14].

We can remember some of the various type of functional equations as follows: One of the most famous functional equations is the additive functional equation

$$f(x + y) = f(x) + f(y). \quad (1)$$

Every solution of the additive functional equation (1) is called an additive function. The theory of additive functional equations is frequently applied to the development of theories of other functional equations. The second famous functional equation

$$f(x + y) + f(x - y) = 2f(x) + 2f(y) \quad (2)$$

is said to be quadratic functional equation because the quadratic function  $f(x) = ax^2$  is a solution of the functional equation (2). Skof's result was further extended by S. Czerwik [15] to the Hyers-Ulam-Rassias stability of the quadratic functional equation (2). Jun and Kim [16] introduced the following cubic functional equation

$$f(2x + y) + f(2x - y) = 2f(x + y) + 2f(x - y) + 12f(x) \quad (3)$$

and they established the general solution and the generalized Hyers-Ulam stability for the functional equation. The function  $f(x) = x^3$  satisfies the functional equation (3), which is called a cubic functional equation.

Lee *et al.*, [17] obtained the general solution of the following quartic functional equation

$$f(2x + y) + f(2x - y) = 4f(x + y) + 4f(x - y) + 24f(x) - 6f(y) \quad (4)$$

and proved the Hyers-Ulam-Rassias stability of this equation. It is easy to show that the function  $f(x) = x^4$  satisfies the functional equation (4), which is called a quartic functional equation and every solution of the quartic functional equation is said to be a quartic function. The general solution of Quintic and Sextic functional equations

$$f(x+3y) - 5f(x+2y) + 10f(x+y) - 10f(x) + 5f(x-y) - f(x-2y) = 120f(y) \quad (5)$$

and

$$\begin{aligned} f(x+3y) - 6f(x+2y) + 15f(x+y) - 20f(x) + 15f(x-y) \\ - 6f(x-2y) + f(x-3y) = 720f(y) \end{aligned} \quad (6)$$

was introduced and investigated by Xu *et al.*, [18]. Also, they in [19] introduced and discussed the general solution and generalized Ulam-Hyers stability of Septic and Octic functional equations

$$\begin{aligned} f(x+4y) - 7f(x+3y) + 21f(x+2y) - 35f(x+y) + 35f(x) \\ - 21f(x-y) + 7f(x-2y) - f(x-3y) = 5040f(y) \end{aligned} \quad (7)$$

and

$$\begin{aligned} f(x+4y) - 8f(x+3y) + 28f(x+2y) - 56f(x+y) + 70f(x) \\ - 56f(x-y) + 28f(x-2y) - 8f(x-3y) + f(x-4y) = 40320f(y) \end{aligned} \quad (8)$$

in quasi  $\beta$ -normed spaces, respectively. In [20], they introduced the nonic functional equation as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} f(x+5y) - 9f(x+4y) + 36f(x+3y) - 84f(x+2y) + 126f(x+y) \\ - 126f(x) + 84f(x-y) - 36f(x-2y) + 9f(x-3y) - f(x-4y) = 9!f(y) \end{aligned} \quad (9)$$

where  $9! = 362880$ . Recently, the general solution in vector space and generalized Ulam-Hyers stability of the equation (9) in Banach space and various normed space by using direct and fixed point methods was introduced and investigated in [21] and [22].

Ravi *et al.*, [23] introduced the undecic functional equation as follows:

$$\begin{aligned} f(x+6y) - 11f(x+5y) + 55f(x+4y) - 165f(x+3y) + 330f(x+2y) - 462f(x+y) \\ + 462f(x) - 330f(x-y) + 165f(x-2y) - 55f(x-3y) + 11f(x-4y) - f(x-5y) = 39916800 \end{aligned} \quad (10)$$

and generalized Ulam-Hyers stability of the above functional equation in quasi- $\beta$  normed spaces using fixed point method. Moreover, they investigate the stabilities of the above functional equation. Murali Ramdoss *et al.*, in [24] carry out the Hyers-Ulam stability of duodecic functional equation in Multi-Banach spaces using fixed point method and also introduced the tredecic functional equation in [25] and investigated and established the generalized Ulam-Hyers stability of this functional equation in matrix normed spaces by using the fixed point method, septendecic functional equation [26] in matrix normed spaces. Nazarlanpoor *et al.*, introduced the Octadecic functional equation in [27] and they proved the stability for multi normed space by using standard fixed point method and also nonadecic functional equation [28] in Multi-Banach spaces. Murali *et al.*, establish the general solution for the viginti duo functional equation in [29] and determined the Hyers-Ulam stability for a the viginti duo functional equation in Multi-Banach spaces by using fixed point technique. Finally, Rassias *et al.*, established the general solution for the Quattuorvigintic functional equation in [30] and also established Hyers-Ulam stability of the Quattuorvigintic functional equation in multi Banach spaces. In this present work, we introduce the following Pinelas-Septoicosic functional equation

$$\begin{aligned} f(x+14y) - 27f(x+13y) + 351f(x+12y) - 2925f(x+11y) + 17550f(x+10y) - 80730f(x+9y) \\ + 296010f(x+8y) - 888030f(x+7y) + 2220075f(x+6y) - 4686825f(x+5y) + 8436285f(x+4y) \\ - 13037895f(x+3y) + 17383860f(x+2y) - 20058300f(x+y) + 20058300f(x) - 17383860f(x-y) \\ + 13037895f(x-2y) - 8436285f(x-3y) + 4686825f(x-4y) - 2220075f(x-5y) + 888030f(x-6y) \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned}
& -296010f(x-7y) + 80730f(x-8y) - 17550f(x-9y) + 2925f(x-10y) - 351f(x-11y) \\
& + 27f(x-12y) - f(x-13y) = 27!f(y)
\end{aligned} \tag{11}$$

where  $27! = 1.088886945 \times 10^{28}$ . We also investigate the generalized Hyers-Ulam stability of this functional equation in Banach Space using direct method and fixed point method. Furthermore, we can refer [31–45].

**Theorem 1.** (Banach Contraction Principle) Let  $(X, d)$  be a complete metric space and consider a mapping  $T : X \rightarrow X$  which is strictly contractive mapping, that is

(A1)  $d(Tx, Ty) \leq Ld(x, y)$  for some (Lipschitz constant)  $L < 1$ , then

1. The mapping  $T$  has one and only fixed point  $x^* = T(x^*)$ ;
2. The fixed point for each given element  $x^*$  is globally attractive that is

(A2)  $\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} T^n x = x^*$  for any starting point  $x \in X$ ;

1. One has the following estimation inequalities:

$$(A3) \quad d(T^n x, x^*) \leq \frac{1}{1-L} d(T^n x, T^{n+1} x) \text{ for all } n \geq 0, \quad x \in X.$$

$$(A4) \quad d(x, x^*) \leq \frac{1}{1-L} d(x, T x), \quad \forall x \in X.$$

**Theorem 2.** (The alternative of fixed point) Suppose that for a complete generalized metric space  $(X, d)$  and a strictly contractive mapping  $T : X \rightarrow Y$  with Lipschitz constant  $L$ . Then, for each given element  $x \in X$ , either

(B1)  $d(T^n x, T^{n+1} x) = \infty, \quad \forall n \geq 0$  or

(B2) there exists natural number  $n_0$  such that:

1.  $d(T^n x, T^{n+1} x) < \infty$  for all  $n \geq n_0$
2. The sequence  $(T^n x)$  is convergent to a fixed point  $y^*$  of  $T$
3.  $y^*$  is the unique fixed point of  $T$  in the set  $Y = \{y \in X : d(T^n x, y) < \infty\}$ ;
4.  $d(y^*, y) \leq \frac{1}{1-L} d(y, T y)$  for all  $y \in Y$ .

## 2. General Solution for the Functional Equation (11)

In the following result, a solution of the functional equation (11) is given. For this, let us consider  $X$  and  $Y$  be real vector spaces. We observe that the general solution has the generalized polynomial form and it specifies the best mapping  $f$  as in Theorem 3; see [46].

**Theorem 3.** If  $f : X \rightarrow Y$  be a mapping satisfying (11) for all  $x, y \in X$ , then  $f$  is Pinelas-Septoicosic.

**Proof.** Letting  $(x, y)$  by  $(0, 0)$  in (11), we find that  $f(0) = 0$ . Replacing  $(x, y)$  by  $(0, x)$  in (11), we have

$$\begin{aligned}
& f(14x) - 27f(13x) + 351f(12x) - 2925f(11x) + 17550f(10x) - 80730f(9x) + 296010f(8x) \\
& - 888030f(7x) + 2220075f(6x) - 4686825f(5x) + 8436285f(4x) - 13037895f(3x) + 1738360f(2x) \\
& - 20058300f(x) + 20058300f(0) - 17383860f(-x) + 13037895f(-2x) - 8436285f(-3x) \\
& + 4686825f(-4x) - 2220075f(-5x) + 888030f(-6x) - 296010f(-7x) + 80730f(-8x) - 17550f(-9x) \\
& + 2925f(-10x) - 351f(-11x) + 27f(-12x) - f(-13x) = 27!f(x)
\end{aligned} \tag{12}$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Again substituting  $(x, y)$  by  $(x, -x)$  in (11), we get

$$\begin{aligned}
& f(-13x) - 27f(-12x) + 351f(-11x) - 2925f(-10x) + 17550f(-9x) - 80730f(-8x) + 296010f(-7x) \\
& - 888030f(-6x) + 2220075f(-5x) - 4686825f(-4x) + 8436285f(-3x) - 13037895f(-2x) \\
& + 17383860f(-x) - 20058300f(0) + 20058300f(x) - 17383860f(2x) + 13037895f(3x) - 8436285f(4x) \\
& + 4686825f(5x) - 2220075f(6x) + 888030f(7x) - 296010f(8x) + 80730f(9x) - 17550f(10x) \\
& + 2925f(11x) - 351f(12x) + 27f(13x) - f(14x) = 27!f(-x)
\end{aligned} \tag{13}$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Adding (12) and (13), we get

$$27!f(x) + 27!f(-x) = 0 \tag{14}$$

for all  $x \in X$ . It follows from (13),

$$f(-x) = -f(x) \quad (15)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Hence  $f$  is an odd function. Setting  $(x, y)$  by  $(0, 2x)$  in (11), we get

$$\begin{aligned} & f(28x) - 26f(26x) + 324f(24x) - 2574f(22x) + 14625f(20x) - 63180f(18x) + 215280f(16x) \\ & - 592020f(14x) + 1332045f(12x) - 2466750f(10x) + 3749460f(8x) - 4601610f(6x) + 4345965f(4x) \\ & - 1.088886945 \times 10^{28}f(2x) = 0 \end{aligned} \quad (16)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Substituting  $(x, y)$  by  $(14x, x)$  in (11), we get

$$\begin{aligned} & f(28x) - 27f(27x) + 351f(26x) - 2925f(25x) + 17550f(24x) - 80730f(23x) + 296010f(22x) \\ & - 888030f(21x) + 2220075f(20x) - 4686825f(19x) + 8436285f(18x) - 13037895f(17x) \\ & + 17383860f(16x) - 20058300f(15x) + 20058300f(14x) - 17383860f(13x) + 13037895f(12x) \\ & - 8436285f(11x) + 4686825f(10x) - 2220075f(9x) + 888030f(8x) - 296010f(7x) + 80730f(6x) \\ & - 17550f(5x) + 2925f(4x) - 351f(3x) + 27f(2x) - f(x) = 27!f(x) \end{aligned} \quad (17)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Using (16) and (17), we get

$$\begin{aligned} & 27f(27x) - 377f(26x) + 2925f(25x) - 17226f(24x) + 80730f(23x) - 298584f(22x) + 888030f(21x) \\ & - 2205450f(20x) + 4686825f(19x) - 8499465f(18x) + 13037895f(17x) - 17168580f(16x) \\ & + 20058300f(15x) - 20650320f(14x) + 17383860f(13x) - 11705850f(12x) + 8436285f(11x) \\ & - 7153575f(10x) + 2220075f(9x) - 2861430f(8x) + 296010f(7x) - 4682340f(6x) + 17550f(5x) \\ & - 4343040f(4x) + 351f(3x) - 1.088886945 \times 10^{28}f(2x) + 1.088886945 \times 10^{28}f(x) = 0 \end{aligned} \quad (18)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Replacing  $(x, y)$  by  $(13x, x)$  in (11) and multiply by 27, we get

$$\begin{aligned} & 27f(27x) - 729f(26x) + 9477f(25x) - 78975f(24x) + 473850f(23x) - 2179710f(22x) + 7992270f(21x) \\ & - 23976810f(20x) + 59942025f(19x) - 126544275f(18x) + 227779695f(17x) - 352023165f(16x) \\ & + 469364220f(15x) - 541574100f(14x) + 541574100f(13x) - 469364220f(12x) + 352023165f(11x) \\ & - 227779695f(10x) + 126544275f(9x) - 59942025f(8x) + 23976810f(7x) - 7992270f(6x) \\ & + 2179710f(5x) - 473850f(4x) + 78975f(3x) - 9477f(2x) - 2.939994752 \times 10^{29}f(x) = 0 \end{aligned} \quad (19)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . From (18) and (19), we obtain

$$\begin{aligned} & 352f(26x) - 6552f(25x) + 61749f(24x) - 393120f(23x) + 1881126f(22x) - 7104240f(21x) \\ & + 21771360f(20x) - 55255200f(19x) + 118044810f(18x) - 214741800f(17x) + 334854585f(16x) \\ & - 449305920f(15x) + 520923780f(14x) - 524190240f(13x) + 457658370f(12x) - 343586880f(11x) \\ & + 220626120f(10x) - 124324200f(9x) + 62803455f(8x) - 23680800f(7x) + 3309930f(6x) - 2162160 \\ & \times f(5x) + 4816890f(4x) - 78624f(3x) - 1.088886945 \times 10^{28}f(2x) + 3.048883446 \times 10^{29}f(x) = 0 \end{aligned} \quad (20)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Switching  $(x, y)$  by  $(12x, x)$  in (11) and multiply by 352 in the resulted equation, we get

for all  $x \in X$ . Using (20) and (21), we have

### 3. Stability result of the functional equation (11): Direct Method

In this section, we investigate the stability result for the new type of functional equation (11) in Banach space using direct method.

Let us consider  $X$  be a normed space and  $Y$  be a Banach Space. Define a mapping  $Df_{27} : X \rightarrow Y$  by

$$\begin{aligned} Df_{27}(x, y) = & f(x + 14y) - 27f(x + 13y) + 351f(x + 12y) - 2925f(x + 11y) + 17550f(x + 10y) \\ & - 80730f(x + 9y) + 296010f(x + 8y) - 888030f(x + 7y) + 2220075f(x + 6y) \\ & - 4686825f(x + 5y) + 8436285f(x + 4y) - 13037895f(x + 3y) + 17383860f(x + 2y) \\ & - 20058300f(x + y) + 20058300f(x) - 17383860f(x - y) + 13037895f(x - 2y) \\ & - 8436285f(x - 3y) + 4686825f(x - 4y) - 2220075f(x - 5y) + 888030f(x - 6y) \\ & - 296010f(x - 7y) + 80730f(x - 8y) - 17550f(x - 9y) + 2925f(x - 10y) \\ & - 351f(x - 11y) + 27f(x - 12y) - f(x - 13y) - 27!f(y) \end{aligned}$$

where  $27! = 1.088886945 \times 10^{28}$  for all  $x, y \in X$ .

**Theorem 4.** Let  $j = \pm 1$  and  $\alpha : X^2 \rightarrow [0, \infty)$  be a function such that  $\sum_{i=0}^{\infty} \frac{\alpha(2^{ij}x, 2^{ij}y)}{2^{27ij}}$ , converges in  $\mathbb{R}$  and  $\lim_{i \rightarrow \infty} \frac{\alpha(2^{ij}x, 2^{ij}y)}{2^{27ij}} = 0$  for all  $x, y \in X$ . Let  $Df_{27} : X \rightarrow Y$  be a mapping satisfying the inequality

$$\|Df_{27}(x, y)\| \leq \alpha(x, y) \quad (46)$$

for all  $x, y \in X$ . Then, there exists a unique mapping  $G : X \rightarrow Y$  which satisfies (11) and

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \frac{1}{2^{27}} \sum_{i=\frac{1-j}{2}}^{\infty} \frac{\alpha(2^{ij}x, 2^{ij}y)}{2^{27ij}} \quad (47)$$

where  $\alpha(2^{ij}x, 2^{ij}x)$  and  $G(x)$  are defined by

$$\begin{aligned} & \|27f(27x) - 729f(26x) + 9477f(25x) - 78975f(24x) + 473850f(23x) - 2179710f(22x) \\ & + 7992270f(21x) - 23976810f(20x) + 59942025f(19x) - 126544275f(18x) + 227779695f(17x) \\ & - 352023165f(16x) + 469364220f(15x) - 541574100f(14x) + 541574100f(13x) - 469364220f(12x) \\ & - 7992270f(6x) + 2179710f(5x) - 473850f(4x) + 78975f(3x) - 9477f(2x) - 2.939994752 \\ & \times 10^{29} f(x)\| \leq 27\alpha(13x, x) \end{aligned} \quad (53)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . It follows from (52) and (53)

$$\begin{aligned} & \|352f(26x) - 6552f(25x) + 61749f(24x) - 393120f(23x) + 1881126f(22x) \\ & - 7104240f(21x) + 21771360f(20x) - 55255200f(19x) + 118044810f(18x) - 214741800f(17x) \\ & + 334854585f(16x) - 449305920f(15x) + 520923780f(14x) - 524190240f(13x) + 457658370f(12x) \\ & - 343586880f(11x) + 220626120f(10x) - 124324200f(9x) + 62803455f(8x) - 23680800f(7x) \\ & + 3309930f(6x) - 2162160f(5x) + 4816890f(4x) - 78624f(3x) - 1.088886945 \times 10^{28}f(2x) \\ & + 3.048883446 \times 10^{29} f(x)\| \leq \alpha(0, 2x) + \alpha(14x, x) + 27\alpha(13x, x) \end{aligned} \quad (54)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . It follows from the Theorem 3, we get

$$\begin{aligned} & \|f(2x) - 2^{27}f(x)\| \leq \frac{1}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28}} [\alpha(0, 2x) + \alpha(14x, x) + 27\alpha(13x, x) + 352\alpha(12x, x) \\ & + 2952\alpha(11x, x) + 17901\alpha(10x, x) + 83655\alpha(9x, x) + 313560\alpha(8x, x) + 968760\alpha(7x, x) + 2516085\alpha(6x, x) \\ & + 5574855\alpha(5x, x) + 10656360\alpha(4x, x) + 17724720\alpha(3x, x) + 25820145\alpha(2x, x) + 33096195\alpha(x, x) \\ & + 37442160\alpha(0, x)] \end{aligned} \quad (55)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Define

$$\begin{aligned} \alpha(x, x) &= \frac{1}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28}} [\alpha(0, 2x) + \alpha(14x, x) + 27\alpha(13x, x) + 352\alpha(12x, x) + 2952\alpha(11x, x) \\ & + 17901\alpha(10x, x) + 83655\alpha(9x, x) + 313560\alpha(8x, x) + 968760\alpha(7x, x) + 2516085\alpha(6x, x) \\ & + 5574855\alpha(5x, x) + 10656360\alpha(4x, x) + 17724720\alpha(3x, x) + 25820145\alpha(2x, x) \\ & + 33096195\alpha(x, x) + 37442160\alpha(0, x)] \end{aligned} \quad (56)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . From (56), we obtain

$$\|f(2x) - 2^{27}f(x)\| \leq \alpha(x, x) \quad (57)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . It follows from (57), we get

$$\left\| \frac{f(2x)}{2^{27}} - f(x) \right\| \leq \frac{\alpha(x, x)}{2^{27}} \quad (58)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Now, replacing  $x$  by  $2x$  and dividing  $2^{27}$  in (58), we get

$$\left\| \frac{f(2^2x)}{2^{54}} - \frac{f(2x)}{2^{27}} \right\| \leq \frac{\alpha(2x, 2x)}{2^{54}} \quad (59)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . From (58) and (59), we obtain

$$\left\| \frac{f(2^2x)}{2^{54}} - f(x) \right\| \leq \frac{1}{2^{27}} \left[ \alpha(x, x) + \frac{\alpha(2x, 2x)}{2^{27}} \right] \quad (60)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Generalizing for any positive integer  $a$ , we get

$$\left\| \frac{f(2^a x)}{2^{a(27)}} - f(x) \right\| \leq \frac{1}{2^{27}} \sum_{i=0}^{a-1} \frac{\alpha(2^i x, 2^i x)}{2^{i(27)}} \quad (61)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . To prove the convergence of the sequence  $\left\{ \frac{f(2^a x)}{2^{a(27)}} \right\}$ , we replace  $x$  by  $2^i x$  in (61) and divide the resultant by  $2^{i(27)}$ , for any  $a, i > 0$ , we get

$$\begin{aligned} \left\| \frac{f(2^{a+i} x)}{2^{(a+i)(27)}} - \frac{f(2^i x)}{2^{i(27)}} \right\| &= \frac{1}{2^{27i}} \left\| \frac{f(2^a \cdot 2^i x)}{2^{a(27)}} - f(2^i x) \right\| \\ &\leq \frac{1}{2^{i(27)}} \frac{1}{2^{27}} \sum_{c=0}^{a-1} \frac{\alpha(2^c \cdot 2^i x, 2^c \cdot 2^i x)}{2^{c(27)}} \\ &\leq \frac{1}{2^{27}} \sum_{c=0}^{\infty} \frac{\alpha(2^{c+i} x, 2^{c+i} x)}{2^{27(c+i)}} \\ &\rightarrow 0 \text{ as } i \rightarrow \infty \end{aligned}$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Thus, it follows that the sequence  $\left\{ \frac{f(2^a x)}{2^{a(27)}} \right\}$  is Cauchy in  $Y$  and so it converges. Therefore, the mapping  $G : X \rightarrow Y$  is defined by

$$G(x) = \lim_{a \rightarrow \infty} \frac{f(2^a x)}{2^{a(27)}}$$

is well defined for all  $x \in X$ . In order to show that  $G$  satisfies (11) by interchanging  $(x, y)$  by  $(2^a x, 2^a y)$  in (46) and then dividing by  $2^{a(27)}$ , we get

$$\begin{aligned} \|G(x, y)\| &= \lim_{a \rightarrow \infty} \frac{1}{2^{a(27)}} \|Df_{27}(2^a x, 2^a y)\| \\ &\leq \lim_{a \rightarrow \infty} \frac{1}{2^{a(27)}} \alpha(2^a x, 2^a y) \end{aligned}$$

for all  $x, y \in X$ . So, the mapping  $G$  is Pinelas-Septoicosic.

Taking the limit as  $a$  approaches to infinity in (61), we find that the mapping  $G$  is a Pinelas-Septoicosic mapping satisfying the inequality (47) near the approximate mapping  $f : X \rightarrow Y$  of equation (11). Hence  $G$  satisfies (11), for all  $x, y \in X$ . To prove that  $G$  is unique, we assume now that there is  $U$  as another Pinelas-Septoicosic mapping satisfying (11) and the inequality (47). Thus

$$\begin{aligned} \|G(x) - U(x)\| &= \frac{1}{2^{a(27)}} \|G(2^a x) - U(2^a x)\| \\ &\leq \frac{1}{2^{a(27)}} \{ \|G(2^a x) - f(2^a x)\| + \|f(2^a x) - U(2^a x)\| \} \leq \frac{1}{2^{27}} \sum_{i=0}^{\infty} \frac{\alpha(2^{c+a} x, 2^{c+a} x)}{2^{27(c+a)}} \end{aligned}$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Therefore, as  $a \rightarrow \infty$  in the above inequality, we conclude that  $G(x) = U(x)$ , for all  $x \in X$ . Now, Replacing  $x$  by  $\frac{x}{2}$  in 57, we have

$$\left\| f(x) - 2^{27} f\left(\frac{x}{2}\right) \right\| \leq \alpha \left(\frac{x}{2}, \frac{x}{2}\right)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . The rest of the proof is similar to that of case  $j = 1$ . Thus, for  $j = -1$  the assertion holds as well. This completes the proof.  $\square$

The following corollaries are immediate consequence of Theorem 4 concerning the stability of (11).

**Remark 1.** Let  $Df_{27} : X \rightarrow Y$  be a mapping. If there exist real numbers  $\psi$  and  $\lambda$  such that

$$\|Df_{27}(x, y)\| \leq \begin{cases} \psi, & \lambda \neq 27 \\ \psi \left\{ \|x\|^\lambda + \|y\|^\lambda \right\}, & \lambda \neq \frac{27}{2} \\ \psi \left\{ \|x\|^\lambda \|y\|^\lambda + \left\{ \|x\|^{2\lambda} + \|y\|^{2\lambda} \right\} \right\}, & \lambda \neq \frac{27}{2} \end{cases}$$

for all  $x, y \in X$ . Then there exists a unique Pinelas-Septoicosic mapping  $G : X \rightarrow Y$  such that

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \begin{cases} \frac{\psi_C}{|2^{27}-1|}, \\ \frac{\psi_S \|x\|^\lambda}{|2^{27}-2^\lambda|}, \\ \frac{\psi_P \|x\|^{2\lambda}}{|2^{27}-2^{2\lambda}|}, \\ \frac{\psi_{SP} \|x\|^{2\lambda}}{|2^{27}-2^{2\lambda}|} \end{cases}$$

where,

$$l\psi_C = \frac{134217729 \psi}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28}},$$

$$l\psi_S = \frac{\psi}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28}} \left[ 14^\lambda + 27 \cdot 13^\lambda + 352 \cdot 12^\lambda + 2952 \cdot 11^\lambda + 17901 \cdot 10^\lambda + 83655 \cdot 9^\lambda + 313560 \cdot 8^\lambda + 968760 \cdot 7^\lambda + 2516085 \cdot 6^\lambda + 5574855 \cdot 5^\lambda + 10656360 \cdot 4^\lambda + 17724720 \cdot 3^\lambda + 25820146 \cdot 2^\lambda + 167313923 \right],$$

$$l\psi_P = \frac{\psi}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28}} \left[ 14^\lambda + 27 \cdot 13^\lambda + 352 \cdot 12^\lambda + 2952 \cdot 11^\lambda + 17901 \cdot 10^\lambda + 83655 \cdot 9^\lambda + 313560 \cdot 8^\lambda + 968760 \cdot 7^\lambda + 2516085 \cdot 6^\lambda + 5574855 \cdot 5^\lambda + 10656360 \cdot 4^\lambda + 17724720 \cdot 3^\lambda + 25820146 \cdot 2^\lambda + 33096195 \right],$$

for all  $x \in X$ .

#### 4. Stability result of the functional equation (11): Fixed Point Method

In this section, we establish the stability result for the new type of functional equation (11) in Banach space using fixed point method.

**Theorem 5.** Let  $Df_{27} : X \rightarrow Y$  be a mapping for which there exists a function  $\gamma : X^2 \rightarrow [0, \infty)$  with the condition

$$\lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27n}} \gamma(\eta_i^n x, \eta_i^n y) = 0 \quad (62)$$

where  $\eta_i = \begin{cases} 2 & \text{if } i = 0 \\ \frac{1}{2} & \text{if } i = 1 \end{cases}$ , such that the functional inequality

$$\|Df_{27}(x, y)\| \leq \gamma(x, y) \quad (63)$$

holds for all  $x, y \in X$ . Assume that there exists  $L = L(i)$  such that the mapping

$$D(x, x) = \alpha\left(\frac{x}{2}, \frac{x}{2}\right)$$

where  $\alpha(x, x)$  is defined in (48) with the property

$$\frac{1}{\eta_i^{27}} D(\eta_i x, \eta_i x) = LD(x, x) \quad (64)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Then, there exists a unique Pinelas-Septoicosic mapping  $G : X \rightarrow Y$  satisfying the functional equation (11) and

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \left(\frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L}\right) D(x, x) \quad (65)$$

for all  $x \in X$ .

**Proof.** Consider the set  $Z = \{h | h : X \rightarrow Y, h(0) = 0\}$  and introduce the generalized metric  $d : Z \times Z \rightarrow [0, \infty)$  as follows:

$$d(g, h) = \inf \{\omega \in (0, \infty) : \|g(x) - h(x)\| \leq \omega D(x, x), x \in X\} \quad (66)$$

It is easy to see that  $(Z, d)$  is complete with respect to the defined metric. Let us define the linear mapping  $J : Z \rightarrow Z$  by

$$Jh(x) = \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27}} h(\eta_i x),$$

for all  $x \in X$ . For given  $h, g \in Z$ , let  $\omega \in [0, \infty)$  be an arbitrary constant with  $d(g, h) \leq \omega$ , that is

$$\|h(x) - g(x)\| \leq \omega D(x, x)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . So, we have

$$\|Jh(x) - Jg(x)\|_X = \left\| \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27}} h(\eta_i x) - \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27}} g(\eta_i x) \right\| \leq \frac{\omega}{\eta_i^{27}} D(\eta_i x, \eta_i x) \leq L\omega D(x, x)$$

for all  $x \in X$ , that is  $d(Jg, Jh) \leq Ld(g, h)$  for all  $g, h \in Z$ . This implies that  $J$  is a strictly contractive mapping on  $Z$  with Lipschitz constant  $L$ . From (57), (64) and (66) for the case  $i = 0$ , we have

$$\|f(2x) - 2^{27} f(x)\| \leq \alpha(x, x)$$

for all  $x \in X$  and

$$\left\| \frac{f(2x)}{2^{27}} - f(x) \right\| \leq \frac{1}{2^{27}} \alpha(x, x)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . So, we obtain

$$\|Jf(x) - f(x)\| \leq LD(x, x)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Hence,

$$d(Jf, f) \leq L^{1-0} \quad (67)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Replacing  $x$  by  $\frac{x}{2}$  in (64) and (67) for the case  $i = 1$ , we find

$$\left\| f(x) - 2^{27} f\left(\frac{x}{2}\right) \right\| \leq \alpha\left(\frac{x}{2}, \frac{x}{2}\right)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Then,

$$\|f(x) - Jf(x)\| \leq D(x, x)$$

for all  $x \in X$  and

$$\|f(x) - Jf(x)\| \leq L^{1-1} D(x, x)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Thus, we obtain

$$d(Jf, f) \leq L^{1-1} \quad (68)$$

for all  $f \in Z$ . Therefore, from (67) and (68), we arrive

$$d(Jf, f) \leq L^{1-i}$$

for all  $f \in Z$ , where  $i = 0, 1$ . Hence, the property (B1) holds. It follows from property (B2) that there exists a fixed point  $G$  of  $J$  in  $Z$  such that

$$G(x) = \lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27n}} f(\eta_i^n x) \quad (69)$$

for all  $x \in X$ . In order to show that  $G$  satisfies (11), replace  $(x, y)$  by  $(\eta_i^n x, \eta_i^n y)$  in (63) and divide by  $\eta_i^{27n}$ , we get

$$\begin{aligned} \|G_{27}(x, y)\| &= \lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27n}} \|Df_{27}(\eta_i^n x, \eta_i^n y)\| \\ &\leq \lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27n}} \gamma(\eta_i^n x, \eta_i^n y) \\ &= 0 \end{aligned}$$

for all  $x, y \in X$  and so the mapping  $G$  is Pinelas-Septoicosic. By property (B3),  $G$  is the unique fixed point of  $J$  in the set

$$\Delta = \{G \in Z : d(f, G) < \infty\}.$$

Finally, by property (B4), we arrive

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L}.$$

Hence the proof is completed.  $\square$

Using Theorem 5, we prove the following corollary concerning the stability of (11).

**Remark 2.** Let  $Df_{27} : X \rightarrow Y$  be a mapping. If there exist real numbers  $\psi$  and  $\lambda$  such that

$$\|Df_{27}(x, y)\| \leq \begin{cases} \psi, & \lambda \neq 27 \\ \psi \left\{ \|x\|^\lambda + \|y\|^\lambda \right\}, & \lambda \neq \frac{27}{2} \\ \psi \|x\|^\lambda \|y\|^\lambda & \lambda \neq \frac{27}{2} \\ \psi \left\{ \|x\|^\lambda \|y\|^\lambda + \left\{ \|x\|^{2\lambda} + \|y\|^{2\lambda} \right\} \right\}, & \lambda \neq \frac{27}{2} \end{cases}$$



for all  $x, y \in X$ , then there exists a unique Pinelas-Septoicosic mapping  $G : X \rightarrow Y$  such that

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \begin{cases} \frac{\psi_C}{|2^{27}-1|}, \\ \frac{\psi_S}{|2^{27}-2^\lambda|} \\ \frac{\psi_P}{|2^{27}-2^{2\lambda}|} \\ \frac{\psi_{SP}}{|2^{27}-2^{2\lambda}|} \end{cases}$$

where,  $\psi_C = \frac{134217729 \psi}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28}}$ ,

$$\psi_S = \frac{\psi \|x\|^\lambda}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28} \cdot 2^\lambda} \left[ 14^\lambda + 27 \cdot 13^\lambda + 352 \cdot 12^\lambda + 2952 \cdot 11^\lambda + 17901 \cdot 10^\lambda + 83655 \cdot 9^\lambda + 313560 \cdot 8^\lambda + 968760 \cdot 7^\lambda + 2516085 \cdot 6^\lambda + 5574855 \cdot 5^\lambda + 10656360 \cdot 4^\lambda + 17724720 \cdot 3^\lambda + 25820146 \cdot 2^\lambda + 167313923 \right],$$

$$\psi_P = \frac{\psi \|x\|^{2\lambda}}{1.088886945 \times 10^{28} \cdot 2^{2\lambda}} \left[ 14^{2\lambda} + 27 \cdot 13^{2\lambda} + 352 \cdot 12^{2\lambda} + 2952 \cdot 11^{2\lambda} + 17901 \cdot 10^{2\lambda} + 83655 \cdot 9^{2\lambda} + 313560 \cdot 8^{2\lambda} + 968760 \cdot 7^{2\lambda} + 2516085 \cdot 6^{2\lambda} + 5574855 \cdot 5^{2\lambda} + 10656360 \cdot 4^{2\lambda} + 17724720 \cdot 3^{2\lambda} + 25820146 \cdot 2^{2\lambda} + 33096195 \right],$$

**Proof.** Let

$$\gamma(x, y) = \begin{cases} \psi \\ \psi \{ \|x\|^\lambda + \|y\|^\lambda \} \\ \psi \|x\|^\lambda \|y\|^\lambda \\ \psi \{ \|x\|^\lambda \|y\|^\lambda + \{ \|x\|^{2\lambda} + \|y\|^{2\lambda} \} \} \end{cases}$$

for all  $x, y \in X$ . Now

$$\begin{aligned} \frac{1}{\eta_i^{27n}} \gamma(\eta_i^n x, \eta_i^n y) &= \begin{cases} \frac{\psi}{\eta_i^{27n}}, \\ \frac{\psi}{\eta_i^{27n}} \{ \|\eta_i^n x\|^\lambda + \|\eta_i^n y\|^\lambda \} \\ \frac{\psi}{\eta_i^{27n}} \|\eta_i^n x\|^\lambda \|\eta_i^n y\|^\lambda \\ \frac{\psi}{\eta_i^{27n}} \{ \|\eta_i^n x\|^\lambda \|\eta_i^n y\|^\lambda + \{ \|\eta_i^n x\|^{2\lambda} + \|\eta_i^n y\|^{2\lambda} \} \} \end{cases} \\ &= \begin{cases} \rightarrow 0 \text{ as } n \rightarrow \infty \\ \rightarrow 0 \text{ as } n \rightarrow \infty \\ \rightarrow 0 \text{ as } n \rightarrow \infty \\ \rightarrow 0 \text{ as } n \rightarrow \infty \end{cases} \end{aligned}$$

Thus, (62) holds. On the other hand

$$D(x, x) = \alpha \left( \frac{x}{2}, \frac{x}{2} \right) \tag{70}$$

for all  $x \in X$ . It follows from (70), we get

$$D(x, x) = \alpha \left( \frac{x}{2}, \frac{x}{2} \right) = \begin{cases} \psi_C \\ \psi_S \\ \psi_P \\ \psi_{SP} \end{cases}$$

for all  $x \in X$ . Similarly by (70), we prove

$$\frac{1}{\eta_i^{27}} D(\eta_i x, \eta_i x) = \begin{cases} \eta_i^{-27} \psi_C \\ \eta_i^{\lambda-27} \psi_S \\ \eta_i^{2\lambda-27} \psi_P \\ \eta_i^{2\lambda-27} \psi_{SP} \end{cases}$$

Hence, the inequality (65) holds for

- i)  $L = \eta_i^{-27}$  if  $i = 0$  and  $L = \eta_i^{27}$  if  $i = 1$ ;
- ii)  $L = \eta_i^{\lambda-27}$  for  $p < 27$  if  $i = 0$  and  $L = \eta_i^{27-\lambda}$  for  $p > 27$  if  $i = 1$ ;
- iii)  $L = \eta_i^{2\lambda-27}$  for  $2\lambda < 27$  if  $i = 0$  and  $L = \eta_i^{2\lambda-27}$  for  $2\lambda > 27$  if  $i = 1$ ;
- iv)  $L = \eta_i^{2\lambda-27}$  for  $2\lambda < 27$  if  $i = 0$  and  $L = \eta_i^{2\lambda-27}$  for  $2\lambda > 27$  if  $i = 1$ .

Now, from (65), we show the following cases for condition (i).

i)  $L = \eta_i^{-27}$  if  $i = 0$

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \left( \frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L} \right) D(x, x) = \left( \frac{2^{-27}}{1-2^{-27}} \right) \psi_C = \frac{\psi_C}{2^{27}-1}$$

and for  $L = \eta_i^{27}$  if  $i = 1$

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \left( \frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L} \right) D(x, x) = \left( \frac{1}{1-2^{27}} \right) \psi_C = \frac{\psi_C}{1-2^{27}}$$

ii)  $L = \eta_i^{\lambda-27}$  for  $p < 27$  if  $i = 0$

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \left( \frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L} \right) D(x, x) = \left( \frac{2^{\lambda-27}}{1-2^{\lambda-27}} \right) \psi_S = \frac{2^\lambda \cdot \psi_S}{2^{27}-2^\lambda}$$

and for  $L = \eta_i^{27-\lambda}$  for  $p > 27$  if  $i = 1$

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \left( \frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L} \right) D(x, x) = \left( \frac{1}{1-2^{27-\lambda}} \right) \psi_S = \frac{2^\lambda \cdot \psi_S}{2^\lambda-2^{27}}$$

iii)  $L = \eta_i^{2\lambda-27}$  for  $2\lambda < 27$  if  $i = 0$

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \left( \frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L} \right) D(x, x) = \left( \frac{2^{2\lambda-27}}{1-2^{2\lambda-27}} \right) \psi_P = \frac{2^{2\lambda} \cdot \psi_P}{2^{27}-2^{2\lambda}}$$

and for  $L = \eta_i^{2\lambda-27}$  for  $2\lambda > 27$  if  $i = 1$

$$\|f(x) - G(x)\| \leq \left( \frac{L^{1-i}}{1-L} \right) D(x, x) = \left( \frac{1}{1-2^{27-2\lambda}} \right) \psi_P = \frac{2^{2\lambda} \cdot \psi_P}{2^{2\lambda}-2^{27}}$$

Finally, the proof of (65) for condition (iv) is similar to the condition (ii) and (iii).  $\square$

## 5. Conclusion

We derived the general solution for the Septoicosic functional equation and investigated its Hyers-Ulam stability results in Banach spaces using two different methods of direct method and fixed point method. **Author**

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
